



PROCLAMATION TERMINATING STATE OF EMERGENCY FOR LINCOLN COUNTY, NORTH CAROLINA

WHEREAS, pursuant to Chapter 166A of the North Carolina General Statutes, more specifically N.C.G.S. §166A-19-22, the governing body of a county may declare a state of emergency, or may be ordinance delegate said authority to the Chairperson of the Board of Commissioners, if they determine an emergency exists;

WHEREAS, Lincoln County has codified in Chapter 32 of the Lincoln County Code of Ordinances, more specifically §32.066 of the Code of Ordinances, that the Chair of the Board of Commissioners may declare a state of emergency, if they determine an emergency exists;

WHEREAS, on the 24th day of January 2026 at 17:30 a State of Emergency was declared for Lincoln County and the City of Lincolnton, at the request of the Mayor of Lincolnton, for an incoming winter weather event;

NOW, THEREFORE it is proclaimed by the Vice-Chair of the Lincoln County Board of Commissioners as follows:

- SECTION 1. There no longer exists a State of Emergency in Lincoln County and the City of Lincolnton.
- SECTION 2. The State of Emergency dated the 24th day of January 2026 is hereby terminated for both Lincoln County and the City of Lincolnton, by consensus with the Mayor of Lincolnton.
- SECTION 3. That this Proclamation shall become effective immediately upon execution and may be amended as determined necessary.
